Summary of Results

Structure Status and Survey Response



SAMPLE SIZE: 749 units **COMPLETED SURVEYS: 448** **SURVEY RESPONSE RATE: 83.1%**


OCCUPANCY RATE: 79.1% **VACANCY RATE: 20.9%**

Response rate is calculated by dividing the number of completed surveys by the number of occupied, habitable, and residential units in the sample (539)

Note: Totals do not include blank surveys; reported percentages were calculated based on total responses for each question. Not all respondents answered every question. Respondents were allowed to select multiple options for some questions, resulting in totals greater than 100%.


Educational Attainment

Household Income


\$36,000 is the median annual household income of survey responding households

Employment

31.7% of surveyed adults self-report that they are unemployed. Of these, less than half are looking for work

Housing

169* homes on the Northern Cheyenne Reservation are overcrowded (more than 1 person per livable room)

48.4% of households are doubled up (have more than one family unit living together)

Top reasons doubled-up households have multiple families living together:

71.2% prefer to live together

33.0% say there is not enough available housing

16.7% say child or elder care is easier together

57.8% of households own without a mortgage


4.7% of households own with a mortgage

33.3% of households rent their housing unit

69.5% of households have at least one individual, couple, or family that wants to live in a separate unit

* These totals are estimates extrapolated from the survey data to represent the amount of households and units on the reservation overall. Extrapolated figures are calculated by taking the raw number from the survey data, multiplying by the rate at which those raw figures appear in the survey data, and applying that rate to the total number of occupied residential housing units on the reservation.


Transportation

18.4% walk on a regular basis


14.1% rely on family or friends to travel
